The Connecticut lieutenant governor has five (5) statutory duties. These include state finance, leading on public health, chronic disease, and early childhood, and ending the achievement gap.

Statutory duties of the Lieutenant Governor as prescribed by Connecticut General Statutes (CGS):

- 1. Serves as chair (or appoints chair) of the Interagency Council for Ending the Achievement Gap. (CGS Chapter 164, Section 10-16nn)
- 2. Serves on the Finance Advisory Committee. (CGS Chapter 50, Section 4-93)
- 3. Serves as (or designates) a member of the Early Childhood Cabinet (CGS Chapter COULD NOT DETERMINE, Section 10-16z).
- 4. Shall be consulted by the Public Health Commissioner in development of a biennial Chronic Disease Plan (CGS Chapter COULD NOT DETERMINE, Section 19 a 6q).
- 5. Serves as chair of the Health Care Cabinet, established within the office of lieutenant governor (CGS Chapter 368cc, Section 19a 725)
