1	NLGA Consensus Resolution Recognizing National Work Zone Awareness
2	Week (NWZAW)
3 4 5	WHEREAS, National Work Zone Awareness Week (NWZAW) is an annual spring campaign marking the start of roadway construction season to encourage safe driving through work zones, emphasizing the need for motorists to exercise extra caution, and
6 7 8 9	<b>WHEREAS</b> , NWZAW raises public awareness about work zone safety and the individuals who work in these zones by encouraging motorists to adhere to posted speed limits, eliminate distractions, and remain vigilant for roadway workers, their equipment, and roadside vehicles, and
10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, national organizations such as the American Traffic Safety Services Association (ATSSA), Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO), and other partners collaborate to promote work zone safety during NWZAW, and
14 15	WHEREAS, road work is recognized as a hazardous occupation, and work zone incidents continue to result in injuries and fatalities each year, and
16 17 18	<b>WHEREAS</b> , according to the U.S. Department of Transportation, 891 <sup>1</sup> individuals lost their lives in work zones in 2022, highlighting the need for continued awareness and preventative measures, and
19 20 21 22	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the American Traffic Safety Services Foundation (The Foundation) maintains the National Work Zone Memorial, which honors more than 1,500 fallen roadway workers and others who have lost their lives in work zones, traveling nationwide to serve as a tribute and raise awareness.

- 24 encourages motorists to adhere to posted speed limits, eliminate distractions, and remain vigilant
- 25 for roadway workers, their equipment, and vehicles in work zones.

- National Work Zone Awareness Week annually and encourages states and territories to promote
- 28 NWZAW and roadway safety awareness among constituents and communities.
