1	NLGA Consensus Resolution in Recognition of the Importance of
2	Addressing Obesity as a Chronic Health Issue
3 4 5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, obesity is a growing epidemic recognized as a disease by many leading medical professional, patient organizations and government agencies including the American Medical Association, American College of Cardiology, American Heart Association, American Academy of Family Physicians, American Board of Obesity Medicine, Endocrine Society, the Obesity Society, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), the National Institutes of Health (NIH), and the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), and
10 11 12	<b>WHEREAS</b> , obesity is caused by a range of biologic, genetic, social, behavioral, and environmental factors, which may increase the risk for various chronic conditions, including type 2 diabetes, heart disease, stroke, and some cancers, and
13 14	<b>WHEREAS</b> , nationwide, nearly 72% of Americans are either overweight or have obesity, with over 42% of the population affected, which represents a historic high, $^1$ and
15 16 17	<b>WHEREAS</b> , all types of citizens are affected by obesity; however, according the National Center for Health Statistics, obesity disproportionately affects lower-income individuals, people with less education, and minority communities, <sup>2</sup> and
18 19	<b>WHEREAS</b> , obesity imposes significant human and economic costs, with the total economic burden estimated at \$1.72 trillion, or 9.3% of U.S. GDP, <sup>3</sup> and
20 21	<b>WHEREAS</b> , rural populations experience higher obesity rates than urban populations, with 34.2% of rural residents affected, 4 and
22 23	WHEREAS, treatment options for obesity, including lifestyle modification, FDA-approved medications, and bariatric surgery, can offer improved outcomes for patients, and
