## NLGA Consensus Resolution Continuing the NLGA Recycling Impact Award

- 3 WHEREAS, the members of the National Lieutenant Governors Association (NLGA) recognize
- 4 many members play key roles in issues related to resource conservation, sustainability, reuse,
- 5 and recycling in the United States and its territories, and
- 6 WHEREAS, the use and reuse of resources impacts the lives of all Americans and impacts
- 7 every aspect of life in America today including the U.S. economy and jobs, manufacturing,
- 8 commodities, global trade, the environment, reducing solid waste, sustainable living and
- 9 development, transportation (rail, trucking, and waterborne shipping), and other recycling, and
- 10 **WHEREAS**, the Recycled Materials Association (ReMA) says the recycling industry contributes 11 nearly \$117 billion to the U.S. economy and supports more than 506,000 jobs, and
- 12 WHEREAS, ReMA is a long-serving member of the NLGA Partners Program, representing
- 13 1,600 companies globally and 18 chapters in North America, emphasizing the industry as
- 14 "Sustainable, Resilient, and Essential," and
- WHEREAS, ReMA has agreed to continue serving as the sponsor of the NLGA RecyclingImpact Award.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the National Lieutenant Governors Association
- 18 (NLGA) authorizes its Director, under the direction annually of the Chair, to work with ReMA
- to present a NLGA Recycling Impact Award to a NLGA member recognizing their impact on
- resource conservation, reuse, and/or recycling, understanding that same will create no
  negative fiscal impact to NLGA.
