## NLGA Consensus Resolution Recognizing America Recycles Day

WHEREAS, America Recycles Day is nationally recognized annually on or around November 15, and supported by Keep America Beautiful, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and more,

WHEREAS, recycling reduces waste sent to landfills and incinerators; conserves natural resources such as timber, water, and minerals; increases economic security by tapping a domestic source of materials as a critical first link in the manufacturing supply chain; supports American manufacturing generally; saves energy and creates new jobs in the recycling and manufacturing industries in the United States, and

**WHEREAS**, the Institute of Scrap Recycling Industries says the recycling industry is responsible for more than 531,500 jobs and an overall economic impact of nearly \$110 billion,<sup>1</sup> and

WHEREAS, the recycling rate has increased from less than 7% in 1960 to the current rate of 32%,<sup>2</sup> and

WHEREAS, America Recycles Day, the only nationally recognized day, is an important way to bring awareness to consumers about the value of recycling and the ways to recycle, and

WHEREAS, such awareness can increase recycling rates among individuals, homes, schools, at work, businesses, and in communities, to the benefit of states and territories.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the National Lieutenant Governors Association (NLGA) joins in recognizing America Recycles Day, and encourages Members to be aware of, promote, and/or engage with America Recycles Day.
