### NLGA Consensus Resolution To Set a Sunset Clause of Three Years On All NLGA Consensus Resolutions

**WHEREAS**, a sunset clause is a provision providing that a resolution will expire on a particular date, unless it is reauthorized by the membership, and

**WHEREAS**, without a sunset clause a resolution of the National Lieutenant Governors Association (NLGA) continues indefinitely as a binding statement of the NLGA, and

**WHEREAS**, the NLGA membership changes over time, and

**WHEREAS**, the nature and circumstances surrounding an issue at a given time may change profoundly with the passage of time.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** as a continuation of the NLGA policy began in 2009, NLGA will place a sunset clause of three years on all NLGA consensus resolutions.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that expiration occurs three years from the time of passage at the next regularly scheduled meeting during which resolutions can be passed.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the staff of NLGA shall review all sunseting resolutions that will expire before the next regularly scheduled meeting for future action.
