NLGA Consensus Resolution to Promote Overdose Prevention 2 3 WHEREAS, overdoses from prescription drug misuse, counterfeit prescriptions, illegal drugs, and 4 fentanyl continue to negatively impact Americans across all states, territories, communities, and 5 demographics, and WHEREAS, more than 115 million pills containing fentanyl were seized by law enforcement in 6 2023, nearly double the amount of pills containing fentanyl seized the previous six years 7 combined¹, and 8 WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control reported 107,543 drug overdose deaths occurred in 9 10 the United States in 2023², and 11 WHEREAS, for the first time in history, a person is more likely to die from an accidental overdose 12 than from a motor vehicle crash according to an analysis from the National Safety Council³, and WHEREAS, participation in one or more high school sports puts adolescents at 30% greater odds of 13 future opioid misuse⁴, and 14 WHEREAS, an average of 28% to 46% of high school athletes have used opioids in their lifetime 15 according to a study commissioned by the University of Chicago⁵, and 16 WHEREAS, a 2008 study by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration 17

(SAMHSA) found that every \$1 spent on youth prevention programs saves \$18-\$58 in the long

- WHEREAS, a 2021 study by Shriners for Children Medical Center found that combining education
- and the distribution of an in-home drug disposal method increased proper disposal to 92%⁷, and
- WHEREAS, 2022 research from SAMHSA found over 65% of teens are less likely to misuse
- 23 prescription drugs if they are aware of the prevalence and dangers of fentanyl⁸, and
- 24 WHEREAS, only 36% of teens are aware that fentanyl is being used as part of the production of
- 25 counterfeit pills⁹, and
- 26 WHEREAS, Pro Football Hall of Famer Randy White has turned the tragedy of losing a son-in-law
- 27 to a fake opioid into a national effort to Tackle Fentanyl with the help of high school coaches and
- 28 fellow sports legends, and
- 29 **WHEREAS**, Randy's work with the Safety Blitz Foundation's programs focusing on high school
- 30 athletics, which combine the popularity and community reach of high school sports to convey and
- 31 emphasize the seriousness of the ongoing opioid and overdose death crisis in our country by
- 32 providing education and resources including an in-home drug disposal kit to parents, coaches, and
- 33 student athletes, and
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the National Lieutenant Governors Association (NLGA)
- 35 encourages NLGA Members to be aware of the efforts of the Safety Blitz Foundation, Randy White,
- and other Pro Football Hall of Famers, to promote fentanyl prevention, education, awareness, and
- 37 community drug disposal programs to address overdoses;
- 38 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that that the NLGA will recognize International Overdose Awareness
- 39 Day each year on August 31¹⁰; Fentanyl Awareness Day each year on May 7;¹¹ and the biannual
- 40 National Drug Take Back Days in April and October each year¹².
