1 Resolution In Support of Making Permanent the Waiver Changes Allowing 2 Respiratory Care Therapists to Continue to Receive Virtual Respiratory Care 3 Services

WHEREAS, respiratory therapists are nationally credentialed medical professionals who are trained and educated in all aspects of pulmonary medicine and who specialize in providing pulmonary diagnostics, treatment, and care to individuals with chronic respiratory conditions like chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), asthma, pneumonia, and lung trauma and other respiratory-related diagnoses such as

- 8 influenza and COVID-19, and
- 9 WHEREAS, respiratory therapists are licensed in 49 states (Alaska is the exception), the District of

10 Columbia, Puerto Rico and Guam, having graduated from a nationally accredited education program and

11 passed an examination administered by the National Board of Respiratory Board, and

12 WHEREAS, respiratory therapists work in intensive care units, emergency departments, skilled nursing

- 13 and long-term care facilities, pulmonary function labs, sleep labs and clinics, educational settings, and the
- 14 patients' homes, and
- 15 WHEREAS, the need for respiratory therapists is expected to increase by more than 20% over the next 10 years according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, and
- WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic cemented the importance of respiratory therapists as essentialhealth care professionals for their dedication and endurance in saving lives, and
- 19 WHEREAS, temporary waivers permitted under the public health emergency (PHE) modified the
- 20 Medicare statute by recognizing the value and expertise of respiratory therapists to include them as
- 21 practitioners to provide virtual respiratory care services typically provided in the hospital outpatient
- 22 department or physician office to vulnerable Medicare beneficiaries in their homes, and
- 23 WHEREAS, enabling respiratory therapists to provide virtual services during the PHE has improved
- 24 patient adherence and outcomes, allowed for timely interventions, and removed access barriers for
- 25 vulnerable Medicare beneficiaries by eliminating the need for transportation or traveling long distances,
- 26 especially in rural and underserved areas, and
- 27 WHEREAS, individuals with chronic and acute respiratory conditions, including COVID-19, will no
- 28 longer have access to the virtual services and expertise of respiratory therapists when the PHE ends unless
- 29 Congress takes further action to make temporary waivers permanent, and



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- 30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the National Lieutenant Governors Association supports
- 31 efforts to make permanent the waivers under the PHE that will allow eligible patients to continue to
- 32 receive virtual services provided by respiratory therapists in their home.
