

South Carolina Office of the Lieutenant Governor STATUTORY DUTIES

<u>Summary</u>

The South Carolina lieutenant governor has eight (8) statutory duties. These duties include service or appointing designees to several councils, committees, and commissions on long term care, hazardous waste management, the business-education partnership, and more.

Statutory duties of the Lieutenant Governor as prescribed by South Carolina (SC Code Ann.):

- 1) Appoints three members to the Long Term Care Council. (SC Code Ann. Title 43, Ch 21, Sec 43-21-130)
- 2) Serves as or designates a member of the Judicial Council. (SC Code Ann. Title 14, Ch 27, Sec 14-27-20)
- 3) Appoints five members of the State House Committee. (SC Code Ann. Title 10, Ch 1, Sec 10-1-40)
- 4) Receives an annual report of an audit of the South Carolina Conservation Bank. (SC Code Ann. Title 48, Ch 59, Sec 48-59-50)
- 5) Serves as or designates a member of the Hunley Commission. (SC Code Ann. Title 54, Ch 7, Sec 54-7-100)
- 6) May serve as an ex-officio member of the Committee on Interstate Cooperation of Senate. (SC Code Ann. Title 1, Ch 17, Sec1-17-20)
- 7) Serves as or designates a member of the Hazardous Waste Management Select Oversight Committee. (SC Code Ann. Title 44, Ch 56, Sec 44-56-840)
- 8) Serves as or designates a member of the Business-Education Partnership for Excellence in Education. (SC Code Ann. Title 59, Ch 6, Section 59-6-15)

Statutory reference

Beginning with the term of the lieutenant governor elected in 1982, the duties of such office shall be part-time. (SC Code Ann. Tit 1, CH 3, Art 9, Sec 1-3-620).
