## NLGA Consensus Resolution in Recognition of the Importance of Addressing Obesity as a Chronic Health Issue

- 3 WHEREAS, obesity is a growing epidemic recognized as a disease by many leading
- 4 medical professional, patient organizations and government agencies including the
- 5 American Medical Association, American College of Cardiology, American Heart
- 6 Association, American Academy of Family Physicians, American Board of Obesity
- 7 Medicine, Endocrine Society, the Obesity Society, the Centers for Disease Control and
- 8 Prevention, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), the National Institutes of
- 9 Health (NIH), and the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), and
- 10 WHEREAS, obesity is caused by a range of biologic, genetic, social, behavioral, and
- 11 environmental factors, which may increase the risk for various chronic conditions,
- 12 including type 2 diabetes, heart disease, stroke, and some cancers, and
- 13 WHEREAS, nationwide, nearly 72% of Americans are either overweight or have obesity,
- 14 with over 42% of the population affected, which represents a historic high,  $^1$  and
- 15 WHEREAS, all types of citizens are affected by obesity; however, according the National
- 16 Center for Health Statistics, obesity disproportionately affects lower-income individuals,
- 17 people with less education, and minority communities,<sup>2</sup> and
- 18 WHEREAS, obesity imposes significant human and economic costs, with the total
- economic burden estimated at \$1.72 trillion, or 9.3% of U.S. GDP,<sup>3</sup> and
- 20 WHEREAS, rural populations experience higher obesity rates than urban populations,
- 21 with 34.2% of rural residents affected,<sup>4</sup> and
- 22 WHEREAS, treatment options for obesity, including lifestyle modification, FDA-approved
- 23 medications, and bariatric surgery, can offer improved outcomes for patients, and
- 24 WHEREAS, state and territories can establish obesity task forces or utilize existing
