**NLGA Consensus Resolution in Support of Efficiency and Innovation in Government Procurement through Cooperative Purchasing**

**WHEREAS**, government procurement plays a significant role in the effectiveness and efficiency of public sector operations throughout the United States and its territories, and

**WHEREAS**, state and local government purchasing functions are directly responsible for forecasting and procurement strategies; the acquisition of goods, services, and construction; the execution and administration of contracts; and the development of productive working relationships with suppliers and governmental partners, and

**WHEREAS**, state and local governments collectively spend more than \$4.84 trillion<sup>1</sup> annually, with substantial impacts on local, state, national, and international economies, and

**WHEREAS**, state and local governments are estimated to spend more than \$61 billion<sup>2</sup> in 2026 through cooperative purchasing arrangements, and

**WHEREAS**, cooperative purchasing is a procurement method conducted on behalf of public entities that allows products and services to be made available to other state and local governments pursuant to cooperative purchasing statutes and joint powers authorities, and

**WHEREAS**, cooperative purchasing is a competitive, transparent, and publicly administered solicitation and contract award process that provides significant benefits to state and local governments, including administrative efficiencies, reduced procurement timelines, cost savings through economies of scale, accelerated access to supply chains, and expanded access to qualified vendors and suppliers,<sup>3</sup> and

**WHEREAS**, cooperative purchasing is grounded in an open and fair competitive process that promotes maximum competition among vendors and suppliers for the benefit of government while allowing vendors to efficiently deploy resources through the use of a single government contract, and

**WHEREAS**, cooperative purchasing contracts uphold recognized standards and best practices of public procurement and supplement and enhance traditional government procurement methods,<sup>4</sup> and

**WHEREAS**, cooperative purchasing is a trusted, efficient, and innovative procurement tool used across all states and territories, and is recognized as a best practice by leading procurement organizations, including the American Bar Association,<sup>5</sup> the National Institute for
