ABOUT NLGA

The National Lieutenant Governors Association (NLGA) Members lead today, always prepared for tomorrow, and NLGA is the association providing ongoing tools to promote your best and ready leadership.

NLGA, organized in 1962, is an independently managed, non-profit, peer to peer association (501(c)3) with a mission to promote the office of lieutenant governor in all 50 states and the five U.S. territories by adding to the efficiency and effectiveness of the office and government. NLGA Members include all lieutenant governors and/or the seconds-in-command in each state and territory.

The NLGA has three full-time employees that operate all aspects of the Association, including NLGA committees: the Executive Committee, the Finance Committee, and the Nominating Committee.

NLGA staff handle press, academic, legal, and legislative inquiries, as well as perform office and issue research, and create and maintain data on the office of lieutenant governor. The NLGA is the point of contact for intergovernmental affairs at the White House, the Cabinet, federal agencies and for other associations.

In furthering the role of lieutenant governors in the global economy, NLGA staff conduct international outreach and coordinate Embassy visits and missions. NLGA completed several exchanges with China, Taiwan, and Germany, and executed a USAID economic subgrant in Mexico.

NLGA professionally plans and executes at least three meetings per year. Meetings are peer-to-peer opportunities for professional development for lieutenant governors and seconds-in-command and opportunities for the sharing of best practices among leaders in the states and territories. NLGA meeting agendas cover topics and skills supporting your daily duties, and those you need to know if you are governor tomorrow.

NLGA presents four awards annually to Members: the *Government Innovators Award* with Sourcewell; the *STEM Spark Award* with Sapphire Gas Solutions; the *Economic Engine Award* with the National Association of Home Builders; and the *Recycling Impact Award* with the Recycled Materials Association.

Colorado is a premier global aerospace hub, boasting the nation's second-largest aerospace economy and ranking #1 in aerospace employment per capita. Colorado is home to an extensive network of more than 2,000 highly innovative and collaborative aerospace businesses, employing more than 55,000 employees directly and another 184,000 indirectly. Hear from three local aerospace innovators on their work advancing mission-ready aerospace and defense solutions. First, Jason Meredith, President of Solid Missile Systems at Colorado-based Ursa Major, will discuss their work in hypersonics, solid rocket motors, and space-based defense, and what state/territorial leaders should know about the future of defense manufacturing. NLGA Interactive Session: The Dignity Index

The Dignity Index, developed in 2021, is an eight-point scale for measuring how we talk to each other when we disagree. Using a few core beliefs: 1) Contempt causes division; dignity eases division; 2) If we put a spotlight on dignity and contempt, we will use more dignity and less contempt; and 3) If we show Americans how they can help ease our divisions, they will jump on it; the Dignity Index can help ease divisions, prevent violence, and solve problems. During this interactive session, attending NLGA Members will learn more about the Dignity Index scale, recognize the language that communicates respect and dignity, and apply the principles of the Dignity Index to interactions.
