Julia Brossart has 20+ years of non-partisan state government experience in the public, private, and non-profit sectors. She is a highly experienced and innovative professional with deep knowledge in addressing wide-ranging and complex needs in non-profits, essential industries, and for government leaders.

Julia successfully lobbied in 15 states and 40 localities in health and telecommunications and she directed a Political Action Committee (PAC). She moved to the public sector as a state legislative caucus Chief of Staff for four sessions.

She has been a non-profit association manager for more than 20-years, including time as The Council of State Governments (CSG) Chief Operating Officer (COO). Julia became Executive Director of the National Lieutenant Governors Association (NLGA) in 2002 and CEO in 2014. Julia led NLGA through incorporation, obtaining its non-profit status, becoming independently managed, and growing the fund balance from \$90K to \$3M over 20-years, while maintaining engaged bipartisan participation and launching new programs.

Julia has been a member of the Intergovernmental Advisory Committee to the U.S. Trade Ambassador since 2015. She staffed more than a half dozen NLGA missions to China, Germany, and Mexico. She was a delegate to an Asian-Pacific Economic Forum in the Philippines with the American Council of Young Political Leaders (ACYPL). Julia's media experience includes time as a radio news reporter and anchor and serving as General Manager of a local cable television station. She is a regular contributor to The Book of the States and is author of the book "Images of America: Fort Wright (Ky)."

Julia's work has received national recognition. "Ending Cervical Cancer in our Lifetime," a national NLGA campaign, was recognized as a top six U.S. association program, from among 11,000 eligible applicants. NLGA's "Lieutenant Governors' Challenge" won American College of Cardiology recognition. Julia received an award for building public-private partnerships from the Steel and Iron Industry.

Julia has a Master's degree in Public Administration, a Bachelor's degree in Broadcasting, and she is a nationally Certified Meeting Professional (CMP). Her volunteer work includes the Main Street program, a 9-1-1 board, and literacy. She was a certified Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). Locally, Julia chaired a city parks and recreation commission, was president of the local Board of Education, and served on a community college Paramedic Advisory Council. She is married with four adult children.
