



Nebraska Office of Lt. Governor Statutory Duties

Summary

The Nebraska lieutenant governor has (1) one statutory duty. The state **constitution** says the lieutenant governor shall be president of the senate, act as governor when the governor is out of state, and serve on all boards and commissions in the absence of the governor.

Citations

Statutory duties of Lieutenant Governor as prescribed by Nebraska Revised Statutes (Neb. Rev. Stat.):

1. May serve on and chair the Nebraska Capitol Commission in the absence of the governor (Neb. Rev. Stat. 81-1108.32).

The Nebraska **Constitution** states that the Lieutenant Governor:

1. Shall preside over the Legislature
2. Shall be gubernatorial successor in event of vacancy in office (Article IV-16)
3. Shall be acting Governor when current Governor is out of state (Article IV-16)
4. Shall serve on all boards and commissions in lieu of the Governor whenever so designated by the Governor (Article IV-16)
5. Shall perform such duties as may be delegated him by the Governor (Article IV-16)
6. Shall devote his full time to the duties of his office (Article IV-16)
